# **Health and Safety Plan**

## **King Tree Parade, Perry**

**Florida Forest Festival, Saturday, October 24, 2020**

### **Health and Safety Plan Specifics**

1. The Florida Forest Festival adopts and will promote the city's face covering policy for parade spectators. The festival will use social media and paid radio and newspaper advertising to educate parade spectators on face covering requirements.
2. The festival adopts and will promote the city's face covering policy for parade participants. Again, the festival will use social media, paid advertising, and mail to educate parade participants on face covering requirements. Where necessary, the festival will provide masks.
3. The festival will delineate (using temporary markings) "family viewing spaces" along the parade route where family units can stand and be socially distanced from adjacent family units. Using social media, and paid advertising the festival will encourage family units to view the parade together; to keep social distance between other spectators; and to avoid intermingling with other families viewing the parade.
4. The festival will use social media and paid advertising to encourage parade spectators to distribute evenly along the parade route. The second half of the parade route (from City Hall to end of parade) in recent years has been underutilized by spectators. (See attached aerial photo). There is nearly one mile of prime parade viewing space (when counting both sides of street) south of City Hall, much of it with sidewalks, grass, and shade.
5. The festival will prohibit food, beverage, and novelty sales along the parade route. Such retail transactions require close contact and exchange of money.
6. The festival will not hold the traditional Dignitary Reception at the Woman's Club. Bottled water will be available for out-of-town parade dignitaries.
7. The festival will use social media and paid advertising to recommend those with conditions that might make them COVID-19 high-risk consider not attending the parade this year.
8. All the Parade Participates must stay in the two traffic lanes and not go into the parker areas.
9. No passing out of any items, including candy, ligature of any kind. NO CONTACT between participates and spectators.
